Sponsor of Soap Box Derby for Special Needs Children

What's a soap box derby? The Soap Box Derby, also called coaster car race, is a youth soapbox car racing program which has been run in the United States since 1934. The cars in this race fit two children, one drives, the other rides. The driver has control of the car and brakes.

What are the cars like? The cars have steering and a brake. Leo maintains the cars and is confident safety concerns are addressed.

Does Spokane East Rotary have liability insurance? We have a Certificate of Insurance placing this race under the liability insurance of Rotary International.

Are the Drivers trained? Yes, Saturday evening at 6:30 PM, July 11, 2009 we have training for the Drivers and other volunteers at the parking lot of Liberty Lake Golf Course.

Where is the course? Molter Road at Liberty Lake Pavilion Park, between E Country Vista Road and Valley Way.

Is the road blocked off? Yes

How are the cars, drivers and racers returned to the start line? The Kids stay in the car and a four wheeler tows the car and kids back to the starting line.

Is there wheelchair user transport, etc? Parents are responsible to transport their special needs kids to and from the Liberty Lake Pavilion Park. Several volunteers will assist racers into the car.

How many heats per child with special needs? Depending on the number of entrants. Typically a child has the opportunity for 4-5 rides.

Height/Weight Restrictions Due to the small Soap Box Derby cars, racers must be 5'2" or less in height and 110 pounds or less in weight.

Time of Heats Group A 8:30 AM to 10:30 Group B 10:00 AM to Noon. Lunch served 12:00 to 1:30 PM
